The magnitude 5.1 earthquake on March 28th was a scare for all of us here in Country Hills West. Most of us fared out well, but virtually every homeowner we talked to had at least some damage - furniture and windows broken, cracked walls, and one homeowner reported that their foundation cracked. Perhaps most visible were all the broken chimneys - at least 30 that we counted... we show photos of some of them below. - P.O. Box Charges, Permits 0.7%




Are You Ready To Ride It Out? by Ralph and Jean Eden

The City held a Disaster Preparedness Meeting on April 24, 2014 which we attended, along with several hundred fellow La Habra residents. Here are some of the highlights. The Red Cross opened a temporary shelter at the Community Center within an hour and a half of the earthquake on March 28th. About forty people utilized the center, although all were able to return to their home Saturday morning. Fire Captain Ernie Ramirez told us that Fire Departments from the surrounding area were called in and responded to over 67 situations. Our Police Dept. handled over 800 calls.

Living here, we all know about “drop, cover and hold on” but during the quake, did any of us actually do that? Can you go it alone for at least three days? When we get the Big One it would be a lot longer than that. Contact John Rees, City Emergency Services Consultant at jrees@lahabracac.gov, for excellent preparedness information. Consider taking Community Emergency Response Team Training, which starts September 13th. Aside from water, food for the family and pets, personal and medical supplies, don’t forget to keep cash on hand, since ATMS will be disabled. One thing we hadn’t thought of, is if your cell phone won’t work, texting can often get through.
