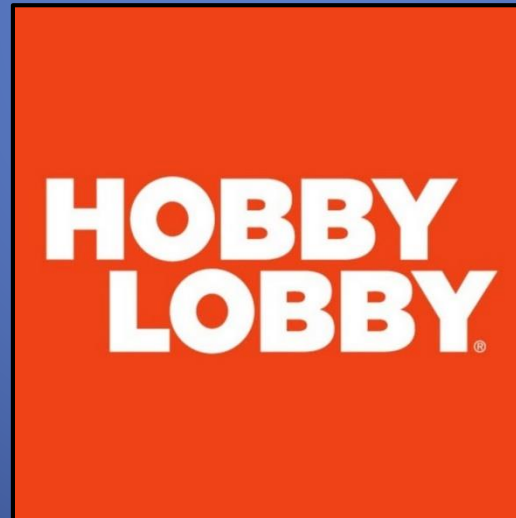

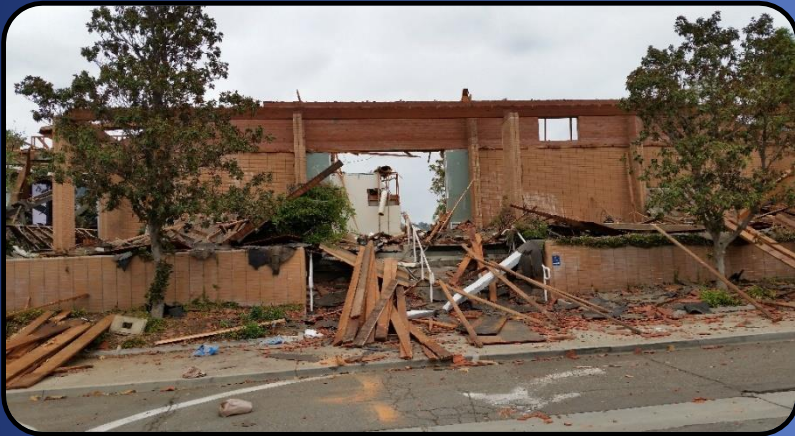

La Habra Police Department

2019 Goals

- Promote outstanding customer service to the community throughout all levels of the police department
- Maintain average response time of under 4 minutes for emergency (Priority One) calls, and under 13 minutes for less urgent calls.
- Continue collaborative efforts with other city departments to enforce the City's graffiti ordinance and address homeless issues.
- Hire and maintain full staffing levels in all job classifications.

Part 1 &2 Crime Definition

- “Part 1 Crimes” serve as the measure most commonly used to compare criminal activity from one jurisdiction to another
- “Part 1 Crimes” include homicide, rape and some other sexual assaults, robbery, aggravated assaults, burglary, thefts, auto theft, arson and human trafficking.
- Other offenses are referred to as “Part 2 Crimes” and they do not have a uniformly established definition for comparison purposes.

Part One Crimes Overall

2017 vs. 2018 City Wide

2017 – 1,359 Part 1 crimes

2018 - 1,063 Part 1 crimes (approximation*)

Part One Crimes – Violence

2018 – 94 violent crimes (approximation*)

2018 - 1,355 property crimes (approximation*)

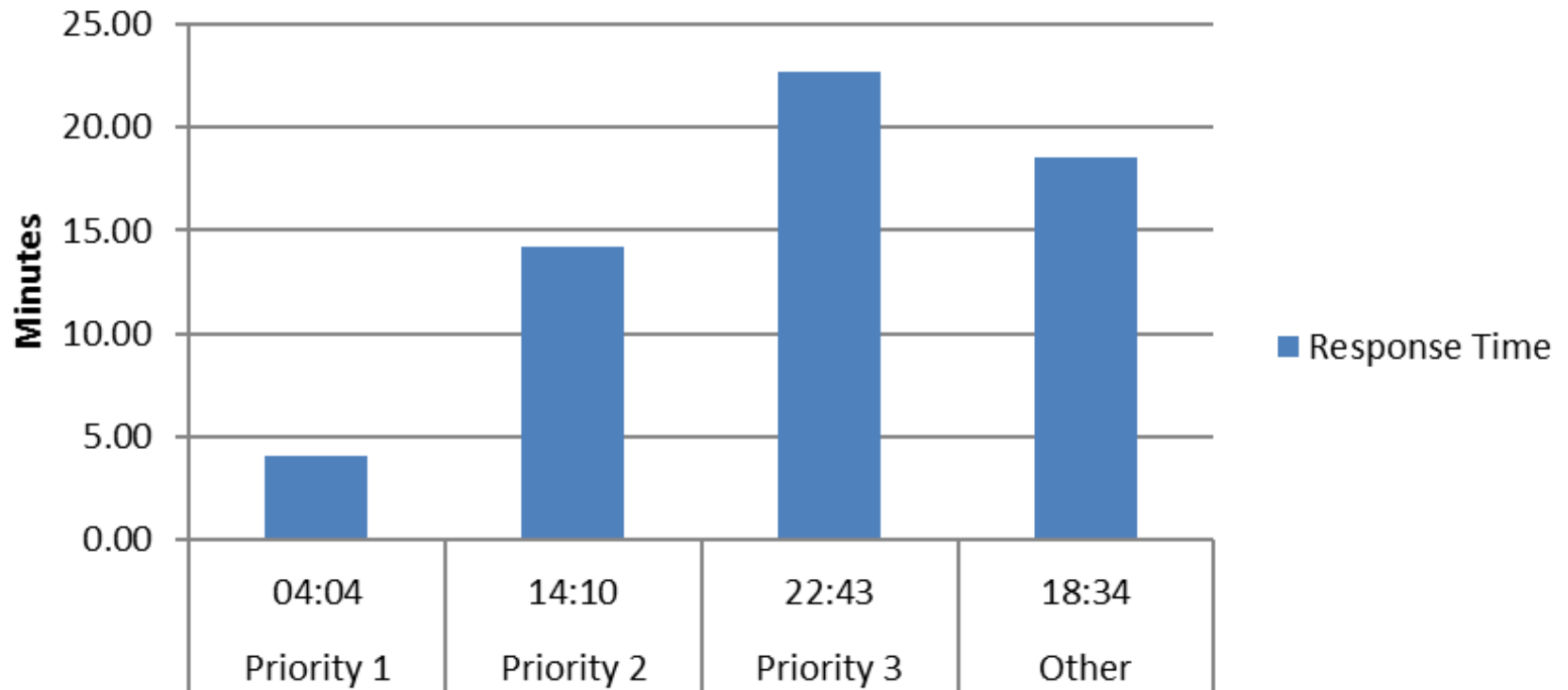

Response Times

- “Priority 1 Calls” are emergency calls that require an immediate response, such as injury traffic collisions, in progress crimes against persons, and other similar calls
- “Priority 2 Calls” are less urgent calls, but require a response as soon as possible, such as alarm calls or crimes against persons calls with no known immediate threat to public safety
- “Priority 3 Calls” are routine calls, such as court order violation reports and crime property reports and other similar calls
- Other Calls may include response for animal control issues and officer observed activities

Notes

- Annual net societal cost savings for exiting 123 homeless neighbors from the streets: \$1,074,528⁴
- Of the 123 clients who have been exited from the streets, 11 have returned to homelessness; 91% retention rate.

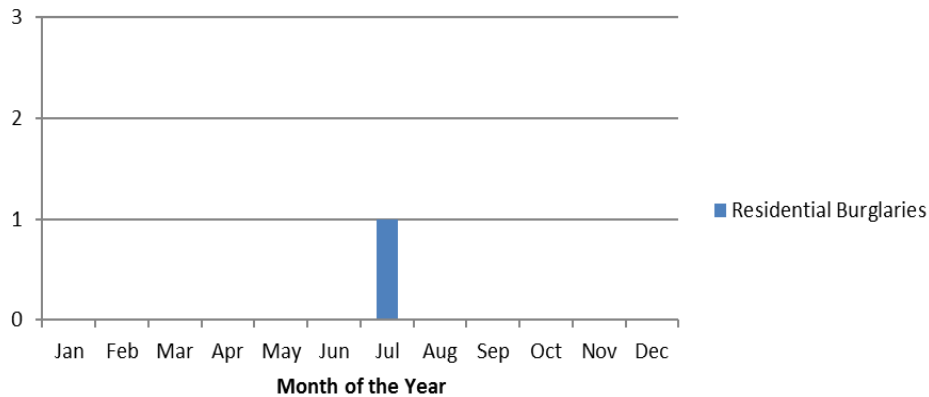

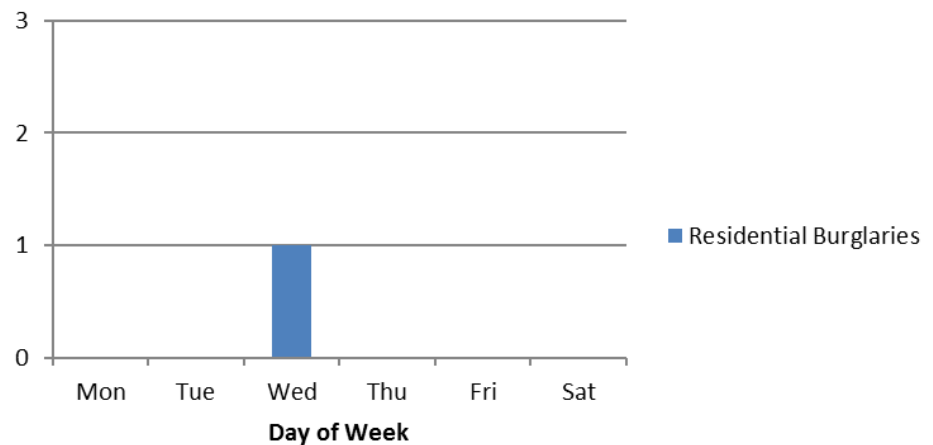

(5 occurred in 2017)

- Day: Sunday = 1, Monday = 1, Wednesday = 1, Thursday = 3, Friday = 3
